## **Drug Information Table** Serotonin antagonists – ondansetron (Zofran)

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Therapeutic Use	Administration	
<ul> <li>Nausea, vomiting from chemotherapy, radiation therapy, postoperative recovery</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Give orally or IV.</li> <li>When treating chemotherapy- induced nausea and vomiting, give the drug IV slowly (over 15 min) starting 30 min before chemotherapy administration, and then 4 and 8 hr later.</li> <li>When treating anesthesia- induced nausea and vomiting, give the drug 1 hr before anesthesia induction.</li> <li>When treating radiation- induced nausea and vomiting, give the drug 1 to 2 hrs before therapy, and then every 8 hrs as needed.</li> </ul>	
Side/Adverse Effects	Interventions	Patient Instructions
• Headache	<ul> <li>Monitor for persistent headache.</li> <li>Administer analgesics for pain relief.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Report headache.</li> <li>Take over-the-counter analgesics to relieve headache if taking the drug at home.</li> </ul>
• Dizziness	Monitor for dizziness.	<ul> <li>Report dizziness.</li> <li>Do not engage in dangerous activities if dizziness occurs or tends to recur.</li> <li>Lie down and change positions slowly when feeling dizzy.</li> </ul>
• Diarrhea	<ul> <li>Monitor for severe diarrhea and dehydration.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Report diarrhea.</li> <li>Drink plenty of clear fluids.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Children younger than 4 yr</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Liver dysfunction</li> <li>Phenylketonuria</li> <li>QT prolongation</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Rifampin (Rifadin) decreases drug levels.</li> </ul>
